

Martin Luther's Hymns to be Highlighted in October

Worshippers in the German Lutheran Church were well accustomed to hearing the Creed every Sunday. There was only one problem – it was sung in Latin by the choir. Luther sought to correct this, so using a medieval tune dating from 1417, he revised the tune and began to arrange it to accommodate the Creed. There are three stanzas to the hymn, just as there are three articles to the Creed. Luther's arrangement was first published in 1524, and then was included in his German Mass of 1526. After that, the hymn was universally accepted to be used as the Creed even when some churches still insisted on using Latin for other portions of the liturgy. While Luther is given full credit for the hymn, there is some speculation that the great German composer Johann Walther made have assisted in the arrangement. Walther was one of the earliest German Lutheran musicians and was a very close friend of Luther.
