Altar Candles are lit at this time representing Jesus' life and ministry.

The four Advent Candles and Christ Candle are lit at this time. The meaning of the candles:

***Hope Candle** is called the Prophecy Candle, it symbolizes hope and the anticipation of the Messiah, recalling the Old Testament prophecies of his coming.*

***Peace Candle** is known as the Bethlehem Candle, it represents the peace Christ brings and commemorates the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem.*

***Joy Candle** sometimes is represented by a pink candle, also called the Shepherd's Candle, and it symbolizes the joy of the shepherds and the joy of anticipating Christ's birth and return.*

***Love Candle** represents the love of God that surrounds and fills us and the love that Christ came to bring.*

***Christ Candle** is the white candle in the center is lit on Christmas Day, symbolizing Jesus as the light of the world.*

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" ²⁹ But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴ And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?" ³⁵ And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. ³⁶ And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸ And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her. (Luke 1:26-38 ESV)

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ And

her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, “Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: ²³ “Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel” (which means, God with us). ^{24a} When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him. (Matthew 1:18-24a ESV)

Introduction: *Silent Night*

Prior to singing Silent Night the Harpist will introduce the hymn as the individual candles are lit. The congregation is invited to join in singing the hymn after the completion of the introduction.

Lighting of the Candles (John 1:1-5; John 8:12; John 12:44-46)

The minister lights her candle from the Christ Candle, which symbolizes Christ, the Light of the world (Jesus Christ) of whom John's gospel speaks. Please only tilt the unlit candle towards the flame of a lit candle which is held straight up and down. Once your candle is aglow with the flame, then keep it upright at all times. Resist the impulse to tilt your candle to light the next person's candle. The person next to you will then tilt their unlit candle to your candle. Use caution and avoid hair, clothing, and other flammables. Also use caution with the hot melted wax. Parents, or other adults, please assist small children.
